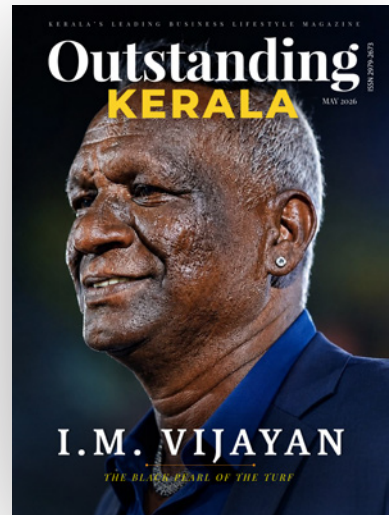

## The Poetry of the Pitch


On the sun-scorched grass of a packed stadium, a man with lightning in his boots dances past a wall of defenders. The ball doesn't just move; it obeys him. In the narrow, muddy lanes of Thrissur, a young boy sells soda bottles to catch a glimpse of a match, unaware that he will one day become the match itself. Across three decades, I.M. Vijayan's playstyle remained a beautiful anomaly—a blend of raw, street-bred power and a feline, almost supernatural grace.



That is the mystery of Vijayan. He didn't just play football; he breathed it. He allowed the silent aspirations of a billion people to find a voice through his strikes, his gravity-defying overhead kicks, and his famously humble smile. His genius lay not in rigid tactical coaching but in pure, unadulterated instinct—a "natural" in the truest sense of the word. Somewhere between those spectacular goals, an entire nation found the courage to believe that an Indian could rule the beautiful game.

## The Accidental Legend: From Soda Seller to Super- star

In the early 1980s, a young boy from a struggling family in Thrissur wandered around the Municipal Stadium. He wasn't dreaming of international caps or global fame; he was seeking a way to help his mother put food on the table. He was a child of the streets, more concerned with the immediate

Today, I.M. Vijayan is not merely a retired captain; he is a living monument of Indian sport. Younger players measure their speed,

their hunger, and their loyalty against his storied career. Even after hanging up his boots, he refused to be "embalmed" by history. He transitioned into the world of cinema with the same natural charisma he showed on the pitch, proving that his storytelling wasn't limited to his feet.

He continues to serve—sometimes as a mentor to the next generation of Kerala's strikers, sometimes as a high-ranking officer in the Kerala Police. He carries the scars of his difficult past and the hard-earned wisdom of a veteran who has seen it all.

## Turning Points & Achievements

The Three-Time King: AIFF Player of the Year in 1992, 1997, and 1999—the first Indian to achieve such a dominant "hat-trick" of individual honors.

The Lightning Strike: In 1999, he etched his name into global history by scoring one of the fastest international goals ever recorded—netting against Bhutan in just 12 seconds.

### **National Honors:**

Awarded the Arjuna Award in 2003, a formal recognition of his status in the pantheon of Indian sporting legends.

In the humid evenings of Kerala, where football talk spills from tea shops into the hearts of the youth, someone will inevitably describe "that" Vijayan goal. A flick over a defender's head. A volley from an impossible angle. A burst of speed that seemed to defy the laws of physics.

In that collective remembering, I.M. Vijayan continues to exist not as a figure from the past, but as an eternal, evolving presence. He has been the dreamer, the survivor, the captain, and the icon. Long after the stadium lights fade, the spirit of the boy from Thrissur continues to sprint across the soul of Indian football.
